



Enrolment Compliance Policy

Source of Obligation	<p>The Victorian Registration Standards require the College to have:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• (sch 4 cl 7 ETR Regs) a minimum of 20 students enrolled in the College.• (sch 4 cl 8) a clearly defined enrolment policy that complies with all applicable State and Commonwealth laws.• (sch 4 cl 9) a register of enrolments, containing the prescribed information in relation to each student. <p>The Guidelines also require the College to maintain and publish an enrolment agreement with parents or guardians which complies with all State and Commonwealth laws and contains the prescribed information.</p> <p>The number of enrolments at the College refers to students of compulsory school age; it does not include children who are less than six (6) years of age in their first year at school.</p> <p>Subject to exceptions, a secondary school must have an average enrolment of 10 or more students for each registered year level.</p>

St John's College enrolls students in across all year levels from Foundation to Year 12, when there is an available vacancy and at the discretion of the Principal..

Enrolments outside of these intakes will be considered on an individual basis.

All applications for enrolment at the College must be completed in accordance with the Student Enrolment Form.

Enrolments are considered by the Enrolment Officer and the Principal each year.

The Enrolment Officer and the Principal will consider each application and make a determination based on the enrolment criteria.

St John's College is committed to the principles of our anti-discrimination obligations. Enrolment Register	<p>St John's College keeps a register of enrolments of all children at the College in Synergetic (internal intranet).</p> <p>The register of enrolment records the following information in relation to each student enrolled at the College:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• the student's name, age and address• the name and contact details of any parent/carer of the student• the date of enrolment of the student• the Victorian student number allocated to the student• the date that the student ceased to be enrolled at the College (if applicable). <p>The Enrolment Register is kept up-to-date by the Enrolment Officer (entries) and Family Liaison Officer (exits and information update). Our Enrolment Register evidences that we meet the minimum number of students requirement.</p>
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Enrolment Agreements	<p>The College requires the parents/guardians of each student enrolled at the College to have a current, signed enrolment agreement. A template enrolment agreement is made publicly available.</p> <p>Our template enrolment agreements ensure that our obligations under:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• anti-discrimination and equal opportunity laws• privacy laws• immunisation laws• the Australian Consumer Law <p>are effectively met and documented.</p> <p>Each agreement also includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• a copy of our code of conduct that is applicable to students, parents and guardians• fees information• educational services provided• the grounds on which the agreement may be terminated by either party
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
