Wednesday 3 September marked an important moment in the College's relatively brief history – on his recent passing, the life and significant contribution of Father Elias were celebrated.

Father Elias holds a special place in the history and identity of our College — he was the first Orthodoxy teacher when the College began, and for a period he was also the owner of the College alongside Metropolitan lezekiel of Melbourne after the passing of Father Kourtessis.

Father Elias was also the long-serving parish priest of Templestowe, and many of our Templestowe students and families, together with current staff and our Chair of the SJC Board were present to celebrate his life and to give thanks. In the past, the Templestowe parish was one of our largest, highlighting the strong connection between our school community and Father Elias.

Staff paused to give thanks and offer a prayer to a great founder of our College and contributor to SJC. On Friday 5 September as a further mark of respect our flags in the Senior Agora were flown at half-mast. May he rest in peace.


